Tournament Rules

DIVISIONS:

KIDS 12 & UNDER

ADULTS 13 & OVER

FAMILY (ALL AGES; MUST INCLUDE ONE CHILD 12 & UNDER & ONE ADULT 18 & OVER)

3 GAME GUARANTEE

1 POOL PLAY GAME FOLLOWED BY DOUBLE ELIMINATION

Gameplay

- Each team is made up of 4-6 players.
- 3 innings of regulation. In case of a tie, extra innings are played until a winner is determined.
- 3 outs per inning; 1st strike is automatic.
- 4 balls for a walk, 3 strikes for an out.
- A pitch is considered a strike if it hits the designated strike zone.
- Only 4 players play on defense, including the pitcher.
- No balks. Just pitch again.
- Outs are recorded via strikeouts, fly outs, force outs, and hitting the strike zone on a force play at home.
- If a ball is thrown home and hits either the backstop or strike zone, then time is called on the field, meaning that the play is blown dead after that point.
- The mercy rule is 6 runs per team, except in the 3rd and final inning, where there is no mercy rule.

Pitching

- Distance- 43' for adults; 30'-35' for ages 12 & under

Batting

- Every player on the team is to hit in order (including any that did not play defense).
- Batting order must remain the same throughout the game.
- If a batter is hit by a pitch, it is ruled a ball.
- If batter is hit in the head by a pitch, it is an automatic walk.
- Any plastic bat can be used (Blitzball, Easton, LOCO, Yellow Wiffle Ball Stick, etc.).

Base Running

- No Base Running in Adult Division; Ghost Runners are used

- Base Running Optional in Kids and Family Divisions.
- Batters do not physically run the bases.
- Use the following guidelines:
 - Single: Runner goes to 1st
 - Double: All runners advance 2 bases
 - Triple: All runners advance 3 bases
 - Home Run: All runners score
- The batting team is responsible for keeping track of ghost runners and their positions. White boards will be provided to keep track.

Defense

- 4 players play the field at once, including the pitcher.
- A play is blown dead and time is called when the pitcher has the ball on the mound.
- Ground ball caught before the baseline can be thrown to backstop for an out. Any ball pass the base line is a single.
- Double Play- man on first, ground ball is hit, player has to get to 2nd base and then throw to back stop to record 2 outs.
